A Parable of the End - Revelation 16

It is over 111 years since the Titanic sank in the north Atlantic on its maiden voyage from Southampton to New York with the loss of over 1,500 lives. Still it remains very much in the public imagination. Increasingly, as I contemplate God's word concerning the end of times, especially as it is portrayed in Revelation 16, the loss of the Titanic appears as a modernday parable for this world.

The ship was 'state of the art'; it was a palace of worldly opulence and luxury on the upper decks but with space below for very many poor people hoping for a new life of opportunity in the USA. Distinct from the upper decks, the lower ones provided cramped and unpleasant conditions for the week-long journey. For the 2,500 or so passengers on board, this ship was the key to all their hopes and aspirations: they trusted it to get them safely to 'the promised land' with little or no thought of how it might end. The ship's owners, designers, construction engineers and sailors had supreme confidence in their creation. But how tragically was the dream shattered in a freezing cold, dark, watery death for the majority.

This world in which we live is the kingdom of Satan, of his Anti-Christ. The vast majority of people are fully on board; their every pleasure and aspiration is vested in this world. It is a world with no thought, other than rejection, for the God who made all things. It is a world in open, brazen revolt in thought and deed against God and his righteousness. It is a world that makes life difficult for anyone who does not conform to its values, for anyone who believes God and rests in the redemption accomplished by Christ for them. These are the people who alone out of all of fallen humanity establish the righteousness of God by faith in Christ (Rom3:31). These are people who, to use the Titanic parable, have already abandoned ship and have fled to the only reliable lifeboat which is Christ.

When God instructs his angels to pour out the seven vials of wrath on this world it will be like the Titanic's passengers with all their dreams and godless hopes taken from them in a moment. How would they have lived and thought differently if they had seen what was coming in the dark night ahead.

When God reveals the details of the end in Revelation 16, he graciously inserts a warning, a call and a promise in verse 15. The warning is that the end will come unexpectedly, the call is to watch, to be prepared (in thinking and allegiance) and the promise is of garments to preserve his believing people from the just judgment of sin that would otherwise condemn them to the fate of all the rest. Those garments are held up in Isaiah 61:10, garments of salvation in the work of Christ, garments that present God's people holy and righteous in God's Kingdom. *AJ*
